Dear family in Christ, my prayer is that the love of our Lord fills you to overflowing - that it grows and grows, and pours forth from you into all the lives you touch! Such love sounds very much like that offered by ... a godly mother! How will we honor the women in our lives who have shown us the love of God? Those who have displayed through their lives the sacrifice and dedication that naturally come from such love?

In Gen. 3:20, the very first woman is given the name 'Eve' (which means living) because she would become the mother of all the living." Eve is the mother of all people who have been and who will be. She was the first mother - the first woman to ever give birth to a child. I wonder if she knew what to expect when it came time for Cain to be born? I wonder if she was afraid of motherhood ... for no one had ever done it before! I wonder if she knew what an important and influential job being a mother would be?

Since the time of Eve, it has fallen on mothers to raise their children for the Lord. It begins as soon as their child is brought into the world. From that moment, our mothers' nurture us, provide for us, teach us, discipline us, protect us. And by doing this, we grow in wisdom and stature, to follow the ways of the Lord, and to have children of our own. And the beautiful cycle begins anew. Eve was but the first of many mothers' who had the remarkable ability of changing the world through her children. What a thought... a mother's remarkable ability to change the world through her love & strength.

This made me think: Is there a difference between a strong woman and a woman of strength? I would argue that there is. A strong woman works out day by day to keep her body in shape...but a woman of strength kneels in prayer to keep her soul in shape. A strong woman isn't afraid of anything...but a woman of strength shows courage in the midst of her fear. A strong woman won't let anyone get the best of her...but a woman of strength gives the best of herself to everyone. A strong woman makes mistakes and avoids the same in the future...a woman of strength realizes life's mistakes can also be God's blessings and capitalizes on them. A strong woman walks sure footedly...but a woman of strength knows God will catch her when she falls. A strong woman wears the look of confidence on her face...but a woman of strength wears grace. A strong woman has faith that she is strong enough for the journey...but a woman of strength has faith that it is in the journey that she will become strong.

This month, we remember, honor, and celebrate our mothers. But this celebration does not end with our mothers. It extends to every wonderful woman who has offered to us their time and wisdom and kindness and joy. It extends to every woman who has lived the faith, conveyed the faith, and nurtured the faith - in us and in others. We express our love and gratitude to all those who showed us, through their lives, a beautiful picture of Christ.
